



So, you're thinking of Mentoring in the Community?

Huzzah!!

Here's what you need to know:

Necessary Skills

No special skills are required to Mentor a Mentee. All you need is presence.

Necessary Resources

You'll need a calm, dedicated space at the same time each week, in which to light a fire or candle.

Your Mentors Pack: T-shirt, A-frame, Poster and Referral Letters (you'll receive this in the mail once you've signed up)

An email with link to the most recent Private Mentors Playlist.

You'll also need a small speaker readily charged for playing the shared playlist.

The Community Love

Set space for enhancing presence. The scent, the temperature, the comfort.

How Mentors get paid

Once you've mentored your first six-weeks, you'll have paid off your Mentors Pack and can enjoy earning income.

Payments are received directly into your bank account at the end of the month.

Of the Hosts you Mentor, you'll receive 33% of their membership fees, with 33% going to administration, and 33% going to Co-Housing.

Co-Housing is a model of living, in which 5-7 people share the kitchen, shed, garden and circle-spaces. Co-houses may be used for Hosting Experience Labs, community gatherings & retreats.

Co-houses are owned by the community and rented by the community, providing a social- & economic- superannuation.

Community members may use their 33% Co-housing investment as superannuation investment only, or for living and working after a specified period.

As Co-houses are purchased on a certain date, memberships purchased from this date forward are automatic share-holders.

Every 5 years, shareholders are invited to sell their share to another member of the community.

All records are maintained by a third party and available for public viewing.
